Good Hygiene Policy

Askea Community Centre is committed to promoting a healthy environment and a high standard of personal hygiene for adults and children. We regularly seek information on environmental health to ensure that we keep up- to- date with the latest recommendations.

Principle of Good Hygiene Policy

This policy is underpinned by the Childcare Act 1991 [Early Years Services] Regulations 2016

Procedures of Good Hygiene

- 1. All new staff and volunteers are informed of the hygiene procedures as part of their induction programme
- 2. Our daily routines in each area encourage the children to learn about personal hygiene
- 3. Hand washing signs are used to remind children and staff that hands must be washed:
 - After using the toilet
 - After outdoor play
 - After handling refuse
 - After dealing with all bodily spills
 - Before and after handling food
 - Before and after nappy changing
- 4. We have a daily cleaning routine for all areas in the Centre which includes
 - All play rooms
 - Kitchen areas
 - Rest areas
 - Halls, stairs, landings and reception area
 - Toilets and nappy changing

Cleaning records are completed, dated and signed at the end of each day

- 5. We have a schedule for cleaning
 - Resources and equipment
 - Dressing- up clothes and furnishings
 - Furniture and fittings
 - All bed linen
- 6. The staff toilet areas and children's toilet have a high standard of hygiene including hand washing and hand drying facilities with hand washing signs on display in all these areas.
- 7. Cleaning records are completed after each cleaning procedure is carried out throughout each day

- 8. Nappy changing areas have hygienic sanitised units for the disposal of nappies which are emptied twice daily
- 9. We implement good hygiene practices by:
 - Cleaning tables between activities and
 - Sweeping floors regularly
 - Cleaning toilets regularly
 - Wearing protective clothing- such as aprons and disposable gloves- as appropriate
 - Providing sets of clean clothes for children as required
 - Providing tissues and wipes
- 10. Cuts must be covered with suitable dressings using blue plasters for kitchen staff
- 11. Cleaning kits are in place for dealing with bodily spills
 - Disposable gloves must always be used when cleaning up spills of body fluids
 - Disposable towels must always be used when cleaning up spills of body fluids
 - The area of the accident is treated with suitable disinfectant according to manufacturer's instructions and the correct colour coded mop and bucket must be used whenever required
 - A supply of clean clothing is readily available for accidents
- 12. Cleaning procedure
 - All toilets, surrounding walls and sinks are cleaned and disinfected every day and between sessions when there is more than one daily session in an area
 - Floors, tables and equipment are cleaned and disinfected daily
- 13. All leftover food is properly disposed in an appropriate way
